

The Four Cardinal Virtues:

Prudence – also described as wisdom, the ability to judge between actions with regard to appropriate actions at a given time

Justice – also considered as fairness

Temperance – also known as restraint

Courage – also termed strength





Goddess Prudence - one of the virtues (Latin: prudentia, contracted from providentia meaning “seeing ahead, sagacity”) is the ability to govern and discipline oneself by the use of reason.

Without prudence bravery becomes foolhardiness; mercy sinks into weakness, and temperance into fanaticism.
